

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NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF APPLICANTS MEMBERSHIP

1 Eligibility of Membership

a) Ordinary Member

Any Proprietorship, Firm or Company having registered and controlled by a majority of persons of Indian Ancestry carrying on Trade, Commerce, Industry, Professional Services and Associated Professions in the State of Penang shall be eligible as prescribed by the rules.

h) Accorista Mamhar

Any person, firm or Company in the Northern States of West Malaysia and in the State of Penang who is not eligible to be an Ordinary Member may be admitted as an Associate Member.

c) Affiliate Member

Any Trade Association representing Indians operating in the Northern States of West Malaysia and in the State of Penang may be admitted as an Affiliate Member.

Associated Member and Affiliate Member shall enjoy all the benefits of Membership of the Chamber but shall not be eligible to vote at meetings of the Chamber or serve in the Management Council except that they may be invited to sit as observers or as advisors of the Council.

2. Entrance Fee and Subscription

The Entrance Fee and Subscription shall be such sums as the Chamber at its General Meeting may from time to time by rules prescribe, but untill otherwise prescribed.

3. Admission of Members

a) An application for membership shall be made in writing in a prescribed Form and shall be duly proposed by one member and seconded by another. The application shall be posted at the Office of the Chamber for at least Seven clear days before such application shall be considered by the Management Council whose decision shall be final unless countermanded by the Members at a General Meeting. The Council shall not be liable to assign any reason for its decision.

The Application Form should be accompanied by the Entrance Fee and the appropriate Subsrciption.

Every applicant whose application has been approved as aforesaid shall, upon payment of the prescribed Entrance Fee and yearly Subscription, be admitted as a member of the Chamber and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership.

A rejected application may not be again proposed for admission in accordance with Rule 6(a) until the lapse of at least 6 months from the date of the rejection of such an application.

In order to exercise voting rights at any General Meetings, the member concerned should have at least six (6) months (from the date of approval) membership of the Chamber prior to such meetings. If the members membership is for less than 6 months they shall be classified as non-voting members only.

4. Aims and Objects of the Chamber

The objects for which the Chamber is established shall be for the promotion, protection and advancement of all interest affecting trade, commerce and industry of the Malaysian Indian Community. In furtherance to these objects, the Chamber shall be empowered.

- to watch over, assist and protect the general interest of trade, commerce and industry in Malaysia in general and in the State of Penang in particular.
- to collect and to impart information on all matters of interest to the mercantile community and to make representation to the appropriate authorities.
- to represent the Chamber's view on matters of trade, commerce and industry whenever necessary and to form a code of practice whereby the transcation of business may be simplified.
- d) to receive references and act thereupon.
- e) to sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, mortgage, dispose of or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property of the
- f) to provide facilities for holding and conducting sale of properties, arbitrations, meetings of creditors, meetings of companies or other like matters.
- g) to construct upon any premises acquired for the purposes of the Chamber any building or buildings for the purposes of the Chamber and to alter, add or remove any building upon any such premises.
- to borrow or raise any monies required for the purposes of the Chamber upon such terms and in such manner and on such securities as the Chamber may determine.
- to arbitrate in the matter of disputes arising out of commercial transactions between members of the Chamber and/or other parties willing or agreeing to abide by the judgement and decision of the Chamber.
- j) to protect and generally look after the business interests of its members.
- k) to draw up bye-laws for the smooth running of the Chamber.
- j) to promote and constructively comment on legislations and/or other measures affecting commerce and industry.
- to promote and facilitate commerce and industry in Malaysia and between Malaysia and foreign countries and the interests of persons engaged in such commerce and industry.
- to communicate with other Chambers of Commerce and Industry and other mercantile and public and private bodies throughout the world and promote measures for facilitation.
- to subscribe to, become a member of co-operate with any lawful association whether incorporated or not whose objects are wholly or in part similar to those of the Chamber.
- p) to issue Certificates of authentication.
- q) to support Charitable, Cultural and Educational Institutions.
- to establish a Charity Foundation to provide Scholarships and/or educational assistance for deserving and needy students in the State of Penang.

5. Use of Facilities

All members are entitled to the use of the following facilities provided by the Chamber and shall be required to abide by the rules and bye-laws of the Chamber.
